RESEARCH PROJECT

The EXPERT Program supports teachers' use of student progress data for instructional decision-making to improve outcomes for upper elementary students with reading disabilities (RD). We are recruiting up to 120 third to fifth grade teachers who provide reading intervention, and their students, for this voluntary research opportunity.

WHAT IS THE EXPERT PROGRAM?

RESEARCH ACTIVITIES

ALL REMOTE DELIVERY

- Teachers **select 3 target students** to focus on data-based instruction
- Initial 3-hour professional development
- Teacher online survey (40-min) completed at pre- and posttest
- Student reading assessments (30-min) completed remotely at pre- and posttest
- During the **12-week** EXPERT Program period, teachers continue to make <u>all</u> decisions related to instruction with support of suite of EXPERT tools
 - Collect weekly progress data for target students
 - Enter in EXPERT Monitoring Tool
 - Intensify instruction with coaching support
- Estimated 1 hr/week time commitment
